Death by Cell Phone

The National Safety Council is encouraging employers and states to ban cell phone use while driving. "Death by Cell Phone" is the title of a new billboard campaign launched by the National Safety Council.

The billboards feature a 61-year-old wife, mother and grandmother from Oklahoma, and a 16-year-old from Michigan, both killed in car crashes caused by driving and talking on a cell phone.

According to a 2008 poll by Nationwide Insurance, 81% of cell phone users say they are on their phones while driving and 18% admit to texting while driving. Currently the State of Ohio does not have a texting ban while driving. The State of West Virginia only has
