00000000000 Heat Stroke-a condition that occurs when the body becomes unable to control its temperature, and can cause death or permanent disability. 

#### **Symptoms**

- High body temperature
- Confusion
- Loss of coordination
- Hot, dry skin or profuse sweating
- Throbbing headache
- Seizures, coma

- First Aid
  - Request immediate medical assistance
- Move the worker to a cool, shaded area.
- Remove excess clothing and apply cool water to their body.

Heat Exhaustion-the body's response to an excessive loss of water and salt, usually through sweating.
