Services- BHAAA8 contracts with service providers to deliver the following:

- •Long-Term Care Consultations- assists individuals in making informed decisions regarding long-term care
- •Caregiver Advocacy- addresses needs of informal caregivers and their loved ones; includes: a caregiver resource library, in-home training, respite care, support groups and a working caregiver assistance program
- •The Assisted Living Waiver Program- pays for a variety of assisted living services; includes: Medicaid card to assist with physician visits, nursing services, therapies and other services
- •Housing Services- includes home modifications and repairs
- •Alzheimer's Respite Care- temporary care for an Alzheimer's diagnosed individual to give regular caregiver a break
- •Residential State Supplement- assists qualified individuals who live in approved group settings but who do not medically qualify for nursing home placement
- •Long-Term Care Ombudsman Program- advocates for quality care and negotiates for solutions to problems that arise between providers and consumers of long-term care services
- •Project Lifesaver- rapid response search and rescue service
- •Choices- allows consumers to directly employ service providers in the home
- •Passport- provides an in-home alternative to nursing home care
- •Application Assistance- i.e. HEAP, Medicare Extra help, Medicare Savings Programs
- •"Healthy U"- teaches life skills as well as how to manage one's chronic disease

Eligibility Requirements- vary from program to program; determined by an assessment performed by BH-AAA8

Costs for Receiving Services- The long-term care consultation is a free service. Some programs have a co-pay requirement while others have no cost associated with receiving the service. Donations are accepted for all programs.

- •Homebuyer Workshops- prepare individuals for homeownership; includes information on home loans, credit reports, and the closing process. Certificates of completion are issued to participants of Homebuyer seminars to help them qualify for loan programs.
- •Reverse Mortgage- enables homeowners, 62 and older, tap the equity in their home; counseling and certificate
- •Default Counseling & Foreclosure Prevention- As a H.U.D. certified counseling agency, CCCS assists people experiencing difficulty making their house payments. CCCS works with individual and lender for possible outcomes: forbearance, deferment, refinance/rewrites, workouts/repayment plans.
- •Workshops and Seminars- a variety of housing related topics are offered to all segments of the community
- •Financial Counseling- professional, confidential financial counseling which stresses money management so clients can meet current obligations while saving
- •Debt Management Program- assists clients experiencing problems to become debt free
- •Financial Management Program- helps seniors and disabled people remain independent
- •SSI Representative Payee Program- The Social Security Administration recognizes CCCS as a Representative Payee; responsible for using SSI benefits on behalf of the recipient for his/her personal care and well-being.

Eligibility Requirements- none

Costs for Receiving Services- fee and/or donation for services based on the ability of individual to pay. No one is refused because he or she cannot pay.

Area- Washington County; depending on number of people in the shelter, also assists individuals from Noble and Morgan Counties in Ohio as well as from Northern Wood County in West Virginia.

•Crisis Services- crisis intervention counseling; registered certified nurse

- •Crisis Services, Women- 24-hour short-term emergency homeless shelter for single women and women with children. Offers meals, lodging and case management. Crisis Intervention is provided to identify urgent needs such as housing, education and medical care; helps assess, refer and direct women to the necessary resources to sustain a safe and productive way of life.
- •Crisis Services, Men- Shelter offers a safe, comfortable environment for men to sleep at night. For any man in the community, a day room is also provided as a warming and cooling center during extreme weather conditions. Good reading materials, games and Christian videos are made available for use. Case management is provided to assist guests with employment, housing needs and for those struggling with self destructive lifestyles.
- •Life Recovery Programs- life and work management programs; job and housing search assistance
- •Women's Life Recovery- offers help and hope for women and children in desperate circumstances. Whether struggling with chemical dependency, domestic violence issues or dysfunctional and co-dependent lifestyles, the majority of those served have suffered physical, emotional and sexual abuse. This long-term program provides the support necessary for recovery, empowerment, release and development of a healthy and whole outlook that will last a lifetime.
- •Men's Life Recovery- designed to help men overcome addictions and other self-destructive behaviors. Curriculum offers Bible classes, recovery and relapse prevention training, general life-skills application and so much more to enable men to establish healthy relationships and to develop Godly choices that will benefit their lives and those around them.
- •Food Service- food pantry; on site meals
- •Transportation- to professional and medical appointments

Eligibility Requirements- Cannot be Tier sex offender. Individuals who have been charged with a felony are dealt with on an individual basis; must submit to random drug screenings. Religious service attendance required. Lack of prior residency in Washington County can be a factor.

- •Senior Nutrition Program- provides hot meals; includes Home Delivered Meals
- •Senior Homemaker-in-home services (i.e. housework and assistance to seniors)
- Employment and Training-
- •Workforce Investment Act- assists displaced homemakers and dislocated workers in training and education

- •Senior Aide Program (Title V) seniors receive training and update skills to re-enter workforce
- •One Stop Employment and Training Center- resource room includes tools to apply for jobs, create resumes, etc.
- •Alternatives to Delinquency- Juvenile Court assigns youth to work in public sector to make restitution for fines
- Health Services-
- •Women Infants and Children- supplemental food program
- Housing and Transportation-
- •Home Weatherization Assistance Program- crews weatherize homes
- •Electrical Partnership Program- An energy auditor comes into the home to review electrical usage and gives advice on lowering usage
- •Assisted Housing Programs- provides low cost, safe and sanitary housing to clients with disabilities
- •Community Housing Improvement Program- provides housing services such as down payment assistance and repair
- •Non-Emergency Medical Transportation- trips to clients to doctor's appointments and other medical trips
- •Community Action Bus Lines- public transportation across Washington County. Fares are 80 cents one-way in the City of Marietta. Fares across Washington County range from 1 to 3 dollars, depending on distance
- •Section 8 HUD Tenant Based Assistance Program- provides rental assistance and utility support to low income families
- Outreach-
- •Home Energy Assistance Program- assistance with the costs of heating and cooling
- •Secret Santa- pairs donors with under-privileged children for Christmas presents
- •Ohio Benefit Bank- allows clients to see which public assistance programs they may be eligible for; assistance with paperwork
- •Backpack Program- new backpacks for children
